Electoral Review of Knowsley and Boundary Changes

he Local Government Boundary Commission has commenced an electoral review of Knowsley at the request of Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council. The results of the review will not affect Cronton. All the boundary changes are internal there is no change to the external boundaries. Changes to Whiston South (Our Ward) will included some of the streets to the North of Whiston South that may result in a change to the

voting balance of the region as this area tends to vote Liberal rather than Labour and an increase in the total number of voters per Ward.

The total number of Ward Councillors will be reduced by 18 to 45 Councillors and Cronton will still be represented by 3 Ward Councillors. However, as the overall total number of Councillors has been reduced, each councillor will have to represent a greater number of voters, impacting on their work load.

The changes are motivated as a cost reducing exercise, as the reduced number of Councillors will result in a lower number of expenses and wages to KMBC.

Closure of Whiston Fire Station



erseyside Fire and Rescue Service (MFRS) have decided to close Whiston and Huvton fire stations and build a new station at Manchester Road Prescot. The new station will have two appliances but only one of them will be staffed 24 hrs 365 days. The other will only be staffed during spate conditions using the wholetime retained system. This system of staffing relies on full time firefighters being on call during their off duty periods. They will respond from their homes

when required.

The result of this proposal is a reduction in the level of service previously provided. Should an incident occur in Cronton the nearest fire appliances will be mobilised using GPS technology. This may mean the nearest appliance may be in Belle Vale in south Liverpool.

Arrangements exist between MFRS and Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service where appliances from Widnes will attend incidents in Cronton. Widnes fire station is slightly



nearer than the new station in Prescot and the route is more direct.

We have been assured that 3 appliances will attend any house fire in Cronton and the reduction in attendance time is minimal.

MFRS offer free smoke alarms and fire safety advice. If you would like a smoke alarm or advice then contact MFRS on 0800 7315958.

HOLY FAMILY CHURCH TO REMAIN OPEN

ollowing a long consultation process it has been announced that Holy Family Church will remain open.

There had been a proposal by the Pastoral Area Leadership Team in the Pastoral Area of St Charles Borromeo, Widnes that Holy Family should no longer be used as a place of worship.

This caused a great deal of concern and distress to many Village residents of different denominations and as a consequence a steering group was established with the aim of challenging this proposal. The steering group was chaired by Chris Roderick.

The Archbishop's Council (Liverpool Archdiocese) met to consider the Pastoral Area Leadership Team's proposal on 17th July, 2014. The Council's



decision agreed with one of the observations in the

steering group's counter proposal which questioned why Holy Family was within a Widnes Pastoral Area when geographically it is situated in Knowsley.

Consequently, as of 5th
September, 2014, Holy
Family RC parish is no
longer part of the Pastoral
Area of St Charles
Borromeo (Widnes) but is
now part of the Pastoral
Area of St Margaret
Clitheroe and is part of
the parish of St Leo's,
Lickers Lane, Whiston.
The new Parish Priest is
Fr. Michael McCormick who
is resident at St. Leo's.

The steering group would like to thank everyone in the Village and also the many non-residents who were eager to support the campaign.


