Community Governance Review of Town and Parish Councils

The Boundary Commission requires principal authorities to undertake a governance review of its town and parish councils every 10 to 15 years. Knowsley Council is now undertaking such a review.

The forthcoming changes to town council wards provides an ideal time for Knowsley Council to carry out such a review and to give the community an opportunity to give their views.

This review may result in further changes to be made to the parish/town councils, if considered beneficial.

The review will focus on the electoral arrangements of the existing parish and town councils within the borough of Knowsley. In this context, "**electoral arrangements**" means all of the following:

- 1. the year in which ordinary elections of councillors are to be held;
- 2. the number of councillors to be elected to each council;
- 3. the division (or not) of the parish into wards for the purpose of electing councillors;
- 4. the number and boundaries of any such wards;
- 5. the number of councillors to be elected for any such ward; and,
- 6. the name of any such ward.

Cronton unlike the other parish and town councils sits wholly within one borough ward (Whiston South) so is unlikely to see any changes to its electoral boundaries.

In addition to the above the review will consider if there are any areas where changes can lead to improvement in governance of the councils including abolition of a town or parish council but this is considered highly unlikely.

A consultation period is now under way and will close on 10 November. All households in Knowsley will be leafleted with details of how to take part in the consultation.

C ronton Parish Council is the lowest level of local government. All councillors must live in Cronton or in special circumstances within 1 mile of the Cronton boundary. This means that the parish council is best equipped to deal with matters relating to issues within Cronton. There is no doubt that should the parish council be abolished the services it provides would not be taken over by Knowsley Council, these include:

- Maintenance of the pasture
- Giving of financial grants to local community groups
- Organising the annual service of remembrance
- Purchase of the Christmas tree and organising of the annual Christmas service
- The use at no charge of the council office by community groups

In addition to the above, abolition would no longer give the Cronton community a strong voice on important issues like planning, protection of the green belt, environmental improvement, policing and highway improvements.

<u>Cronton Parish Council members urge you to take part in the consultation with the hope that</u> you will express support for your Parish Council.

OPERATION BROOKDALE



uring the summer Merseyside Police conducted a force wide operation targeting the illegal and nuisance use of road bikes. Over an eight week period 171 motorbikes were seized, many of which had been stolen. There were a total of 35 arrests in connection with the use of such bikes including charges for theft in some cases.

Merseyside Police recognise the nuisance, dangers and distress caused by those without any thought for the community riding illegal motorbikes and quads. Many of the illegally owned bikes are crushed after being

seized thus reducing the number of calls to the police and reducing the nuisance to residents.

There has been a reduction in the number of incidents of off road usage in the Cronton area but residents are asked to call 101 if you have any information about anyone owning and using an illegal motorbike or quad.
