59. APOLOGIES

It was resolved that apologies for absence from Councillor D Thomas be accepted.

The delay in installing a smiley face speed detection device was due to the gas pipe replacement project in the village. Knowsley Council would be reminded to set it at 20 mph.

70. <u>HALTON DELIVERY AND ALLOCATIONS LOCAL PLAN PROPOSED SUBMISSION</u> <u>CONSULTATION</u>

The following two pieces of land in Halton south to the border of Cronton were identified for housing development:

- W4 Chapel Lane to Old Upton Lane Greenbelt proposed for 299 residential dwellings
- W5 Sandy Lane to Queensbury Way Greenbelt proposed for 133 residential dwellings

The Council was extremely concerned about the loss of the Parish own identity by the removal of the physical separation between Cronton and Halton. Infrastructure and environmental issues arising from this large housing development would have significant impact on Cronton.

Councillor S Cooper would co-ordinate a working group to formulate a response to Halton Council's consultation. Seeking support from Knowsley MP was also considered.

71. VILLAGE AND COMMUNITY ISSUES
