Cronton Gala News



This Year's Gala & Music Fest '23' will return on Saturday 9th September and the committee are busy planning for this event, so save the date in your diaries! There are lots of

It is some while ago now but on Good Friday we held our annual children's Easter Event, which included free crafts and refreshments and a picture trail around the Pasture with the children receiving a chocolate egg upon completion. We also had the Easter Bunny who came to surprise the children.



On Friday 5th May we joined up with Natalie Dignam Theatre School to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. This was held in the Community Centre with a range of stalls and children's crafts, music and refreshments including cream teas.

Last year the gala committee also helped to raise funds of over £1,000 for various charities – firstly by sending money raised through a coffee morning to Ukraine via the Disasters Emergency Committee, this raised £692.50 including gift aid. And following our Santa event held around the village last December we also managed to raise donations of around £360. These were split between The Whitechapel Centre, Evolving Mindset and Age Concern to help local groups with issues such as homelessness, mental health and loneliness.



The gala committee are looking for new volunteers who can offer their time to help at events, this can be anything from a couple of hours to as much time as you have! Without volunteers our events may not

be able to go ahead in future years – please consider lending a hand. We would like to ensure that the gala and other events can continue for many years to come. running again. They are looking for new members - see the Facebook group Cronton Village Bowling Club or contact Ste Polhill on 07718 661227 for more info.


Great British Spring Clean - 1 April 2023

CRONTON VILLAGE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Cronton has its own small group of Merseyside Police vetted Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators and we are looking for residents to join our scheme. We also need more vetted coordinators to assist in various parts of the village.

The safety of the community is one of the main reasons people join Neighbourhood Watch. Together we can report suspicious behaviour, crimes and scams to the appropriate partner agencies and encourage engagement with our neighbours.

Through our Facebook group we have been able to make the community aware of recent incidents of anti-social behaviour around Pex Hill. Following a recent meeting between several organisations, including United Utilities, the Police as well as Pex Hill climbers and residents, and a more pro-active approach to policing in the area, incidents so far have reduced. We intend to hold further meetings with Knowsley Police and other organisations to continue to communicate any issues and attempt to reduce crime and ASB. Ways to join us:
